In the same streets that nurtured the genius of Leonardo da Vinci and Michelangelo, new Florentine artisans, designers and artists continue to impress the world with their ravishing creations.





The ultimate Florentine Palazzo

Palazzo Tornabuoni, whose origins date back to the fifteenth century, is one of the most important privately owned Renaissance palaces in Florence.

Once home to **Pope Leo XI** and the **Medici family**, the Palazzo hosted the **world's first opera** performance, when *Dafne*, composed by **Jacopo Peri**, was staged in the Salone delle Muse.

A meticulous four-year restoration has returned Palazzo Tornabuoni to its original splendour. Diverse and rich decorative elements born from five centuries of history, including elaborate stucco work, frescoes and statues have been seamlessly interwoven with the finest modern comforts and conveniences to create elegant and contemporary homes.

Members of Palazzo Tornabuoni will enjoy a unique lifestyle rooted in centuries of history and culture. They will dwell in the heart of one of Italy's most stylish cities, and come into contact with a vibrant social and cultural scene that tourists rarely glimpse.

Palazzo Tornabuoni's position, at the corner of Via Tornabuoni and Via Strozzi, places it in the historical centre of this exquisite small city and at the heart of its contemporary life. One of Florence's most aristocratic city-centre streets, via Tornabuoni is today the vibrant Tuscan city's *'fashion central'*, lined with stylish boutiques.

Top fashion names, from *Bulgari* and *Ferragamo* to *Gucci* and *Prada*, are housed in the grand palaces that line this elegant thoroughfare. And for those who prefer clothing that is *'made to measure'*, custom-made shops are a thriving business in Florence and a benchmark of Florentine style.

A few steps away from Palazzo Tornabuoni you will discover the artisans that still define the Florentine way of life. Intagliatori still use the same tools that their great grandfathers used to carve pieces of oak and beech into whimsical shapes to adorn your home.



Your Home in the Heart of Florence



To begin enjoying the unparalleled Florentine lifestyle in Palazzo Tornabuoni, one can either become an **individual owner** of a **Private Residence** or acquire a **Membership** in the **Palazzo Tornabuoni Residence Club**, which affords residency rights to a selected number of Club Residences within the Palace. In total there are 38 apartments of which 27 are *Private Residences* and 11 are *Club Residences*.







Private Residences


Owners of Private Residences are free to use their apartments as their principal or second home. Private Residences comprise one and two-bedroom apartments, some of which are offered fully furnished.

In the furnished apartments, the interior design by internationally renowned architect **Michele Bonan** balances contemporary flair with timeless elegance, creating a seamless blend of ancient frescoes, marble floors and stone fireplaces with custom-made furniture, warm modern fabrics, and high-tech communication and entertainment facilities.




Club Residences

A Magnificent History

Over the centuries, each generation has enriched the Palace with magnificent frescoes and statuary, creating the glorious historical residence that owners enjoy today.

Some of the most splendid artworks date from the sixteenth century, when the Palazzo became the property of *Alessandro de' Medici*, the future **Pope Leo XI**. As Archbishop of Florence, Alessandro transformed the Palazzo into his seat of power, commissioning leading artists of the day to decorate its grand halls.

At the end of the sixteenth century the **Corsi family** acquired Palazzo Tornabuoni. During the following century and a half they continued to adorn and improve the Palazzo, unifying its diverse architectural styles as well as commissioning new decorative elements. Many of the hand carved marble mantelpieces, as well as the delicate stucco work framing the frescoes, date from this time.





A Restoration Triumph

A meticulous *four-year restoration* has returned the Palace to the splendour of its Renaissance origins. At the same time, the Palace's infrastructure has been updated to offer the most hi-tech, yet unobtrusive, levels of comfort, style and convenience.








Discovering Florence & Tuscany

Stroll through the city's flower market or stop at a grocer's shop to sample a tangy Pecorino cheese. Bring home a bottle of '97 Solaia to sip through the evening on your Palazzo terrace.

Tornabuoni's Attaché service has been created to help residents feel at home in the city, putting the private world of Florence and Tuscany at their fingertips. Privileged access to private art collections, gardens and wine cellars is a unique feature of Palazzo Tornabuoni Membership. The Palace's close ties with some of Florence's oldest families opens doors to private collections, museums and villas rarely seen by the public. Cosmopolitan culture and art lives across the street at **Palazzo Strozzi**, Florence's dynamic Renaissance, modern and contemporary arts exhibition space, which has helped to transform the area into one of the city's most lively cultural neighbourhoods.



Beyond Florence, Tuscany offers an array of attractions. Members can enjoy *tennis* on red-clay courts; *ride* at a world-class equestrian centre; play *golf* on one of Tuscany's oldest courses, attend one of Europe's finest *football matches* or take in the drama, ritual and colour of Siena's worldfamous *Palio* horse race.

Walk through rows of vine-covered hills with estate owners, taste their wines directly from the barrel and share in a leisurely lunch at their family table. Palazzo Tornabuoni's close relationships with many of Tuscany's finest vineyards, including *Argentiera*, *Fonterutoli* and *Antinori*, offers Members exclusive entrance into Italy's legendary viticulture at the oldest family estates.
